- 2. Dismissal- My gratitude runs deep for those staff members who helped to ensure an orderly and safe dismissal of our students this past week. - 3. Teacher Responsibilities Although it is the duty and responsibility of all staff members to address student issues, you must remember your role is not a disciplinary one but an instructional one. That simply means if there are any behavioral issues arising during the school day, it is your duty and responsibility to report it to a Dean, Assistant Principal, or Main Office. It is NOT your duty or your responsibility to try to resolve the issue. There are strong systems in place that work effectively in this building. A teacher's responsibility is to instruct students. You are reminded to leave school wide disciplinary issues to the above mentioned staff members.
- 4. Verbal Abuse- This is a reminder that you must be aware of the way you speak to children. It is your duty and responsibility to remain professional at all times. Below is a reminder of the regulation A421:
 - A. Verbal abuse is defined as language (written or oral) about or directed toward students that:
 - belittles, embarrasses or subjects students to ridicule; or
 - has or would have the effect of unreasonably and substantially interfering with a student's educational
 performance or ability to participate in or benefit from an educational program, school-sponsored
 activity or any other aspect of a student's education; or
 - has or would have the effect of unreasonably and substantially interfering with a student's mental, emotional, or physical well-being; or
 - reasonably causes or would reasonably be expected to cause a student to fear for his/her physical safety; or
 - reasonably causes or would reasonably be expected to cause physical injury or emotional harm to a student.
- 5. **Corporal Punishment** This is a reminder that any act of physical force upon a pupil for the purpose of punishing that pupil is considered corporal punishment.
- 6. Edline/Easy Grade Pro- Please ensure that you are updating this site with current grades, dates and information weekly. Part of your professional assignment is to maintain this site with current information.
- 7. Professional Attire- There are many ways we as professionals set ourselves apart from our students. Professional business attire is one of those ways. Please ensure that unless there is a casual/dress down day, you are maintaining a professional business attire. Jeans are NOT considered professional attire. Thank you.
